Linda has worked at every branch of the library over the years, and is currently working in the Archives scanning delicate wills and other papers to protect them for future generations.

Thank you Linda for your long and faithful service!

2020 presented a number of challenges and opportunities for Archives services.

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the Archives was closed to the public from March to July. From July through December, visits were scheduled by appointment only with time reserved in between appointments for COVID-19 safety protocols. Though in-person outreach was limited during 2020, social media outreach was increased to share postcards and other aspects of the County's history with the community. An at-home request service, launched in March, allowed 60 researchers to make requests from home with copies provided by mail or electronically. For the first time, the Ancestry Library Edition was made available for patrons to use from home. Archives staff created a video instruction guide and assisted people in the use of this service.

2020 Highlights

- Shared a postcard from our collection for weekly "Throwback Thursday" posts on social media
- Posted a photograph and accompanying question so patrons could share their oral history memories
- Invited patrons to ask us questions on Instagram for an Ask the Archivist day
- Created an online tutorial to show patrons how to use the library version of Ancestry
- Via Zoom, we conversed with homeowner Braydon Scully and PEHAC member Liz Driver about the Historic Designation process followed by Q and A session with event attendees
- Created a Historic Designation blog post about the Zoom event with additional content from homeowner Debby Cermak
- Through the sale of replica Tremaine Maps, and with the assistance of patron donations, the Archives were able to purchase a much needed microfilm scanner in May 2020.

Prince Edward County Archives and the Prince Edward County Historical Society: partners in protecting, preserving and sharing the County's history

The Archives was founded on October 25, 1983 under the authority of Bylaw 1568 which established the mandate and activities of the Archives.

Until 2010, the Archives was operated by Historical Society volunteers through the summer months at the old jail in Picton. In 2009, the Historical Society officially gifted the collection, formerly on deposit, to the Archives. It was in that same year that the Historical Society approached the library to take over the Archives and in 2010 it became official.

On February 14, 2010 the last of the Archival records were moved out of the jail and into the current facility at the Wellington Branch Library. The Archives were in operation year-round and a full-time staff member was employed to run the research facility.

The relationship between the Archives and the Historical Society has been ongoing. The Historical Society has provided assistance and partnerships in applying for grants, working on projects, special events and outreach activities. This has included the Diamond Jubilee and Fibre Fest, where the Archives was able to assist the Historical Society in planning, research and promotion.

The Historical Society provides the Archives with the HODGE Grant which contributes to the operation of the facility. When a question about Prince Edward County's history arises, the Historical Society will forward research requests to the Archives. The Archives arranges guest speaking events, hosts class visits, and works closely with schools, allowing people to experience history through documents, manuscripts, and other visual aids.

The Archives makes the Historical Society's books available for sale, and copies of these books are also available for sale at the Bloomfield Booktique at the Bloomfield Branch Library, which attracts locals and tourists alike.

By advocating for the Archives, the Historical Society supports and works within its Mission Statement of, "stimulating and encourage interest within the community in the study of history and Heritage of Prince Edward County, encourage and foster awareness in children and youth through education, preserving existing documents, and in cooperating with related organizations."

In 2012 the Historical Society updated the constitution and worked towards creating a cohesive brand.

Through this partnership, the County of Prince Edward Public Library & Archives and Prince Edward Historical Society have been able to serve researchers, assist students and not only make history available but come alive.
