





Special Grant Funding Received in 2022

My Main Street Community Activator Funding

Bringing library service outdoors at the Bloomfield Branch Library. Programs made possible included an Indigenous Arts Series with Melanie Grey, a writer's series with Andrew Binks, local history talks with Joanne Cournyea-Fralick, a presentation by Andrew McLuhan about the McLuhan Institute, a presentation about the study of flags with Rob Leek and more.

Outdoor furniture and children's toys further enhance the space.

The Writer's Union through the Canada Council for the Arts allowed us to virtually host Maude Barlow in conversation about her book, "Still Hopeful".



Strategic Plan

In 2022 the library board extended the existing strategic plan with the following goals:

- #1. Develop branches to accommodate community needs as they grow and change
- #2. Lead Prince Edward County's passion for reading, personal growth and learning
- #3. Reduce barriers for access
- #4. Foster an organizational culture of innovation



#1 Develop branches to accommodate community needs as they grow and change

One strategy to accomplish this goal is experimenting with new initiatives at each branch.

Ameliasburgh

Innovative Writers-in-Residence from the Al Purdy A-Frame experimented with new ways to reach the community through innovative projects. The Friends of Ameliasburgh & Consecon Branches of the library celebrated the retirement of long-serving Friend Helen McLachlan by adding new books to the library collection.

Bloomfield

With support from the Government of Canada through "My Main Street Community Activator Placemaking Programs", a new outdoor space was created and special programs with guest speakers inspired and educated attendees.

Consecon

Thanks to a generous benefactor, the Consecon Branch Library added new, easy-to-move shelving. This makes it possible for the branch to host larger groups and events by moving the shelves. This is a great complement to the recently completed lobby reno which added an automatic door and refreshed the entire space. The Consecon Branch Library also served as an advanced polling location for the municipal election

Milford - The Milford Branch Library learned that there is an acrobatics class for children happening at the town hall, and that families and caregivers needed a welcoming place to wait for their student. The library began opening in the evening as a way of meeting community needs.

Picton - The Picton Branch Library expansion is well underway. This community-supported project is many years in the making and will provide countless new opportunities for services and programs.

Wellington - The Wellington Branch Library's Dianne Cranshaw meeting room became the home for many of the groups who were displaced when the Picton Branch Library meeting room became unavailable due to the construction. A popular ukulele class, led by William Tunbull, started many aspiring musicians on their uke journey. Don Hinde and the Library Orchestra spent many hours practicing and are now ready to take bookings with proceeds supporting the library. The Friends of the Wellington Branch Library's Canada Day and Pumpkinfest book sales returned to the appreciation of the community.

1000 Books Before Kindergarten Program & the Impressive Reader Society encourage the earliest learners to celebrate reading. The library received funds from IDA Ontario to add decodable readers (ideal for people with dyslexia), as well as from Sarah Badgley Literacy Fund for Rural Ontario Children for board books and early readers.

#3 Reduce barriers for access

The library has committed to live-streaming or recording programs and talks when possible to increase participation. The library applied for, and received, funds from the Youth Accessibility Fund to create a Sensory Room in the expanded Picton Branch Library. This will create a safer space for people who need a quiet place to spend time. Home delivery in partnership with Community Care for Seniors helps ensure that no one is left without reading material.


Thank you to **Alexandra Bake** and her tireless fundraising committee for their continued efforts in support of the Picton Branch Library expansion.
