**PRINCE EDWARD COUNTY, ONTARIO.** Multi-award winning Indigenous folk duo *Twin Flames* are bringing their talents to Picton's Regent Theatre, now taking place on Saturday, June 24<sup>th</sup>, 2023 at 2 p.m. as a celebration of National Indigenous Peoples' Day. Husband and wife duo Jaaji & Chelsey June, of Nunavik and Ottawa respectively, combine traditional Indigenous story-telling and music with western harmonies to entertain and educate family audiences.

This co-production with the County of Prince Edward Public Library and Archives will be presented live to audiences and live-streamed to those unable to attend in-person. The event is supported by The County Museums, whose staff will provide tours of the Indigenous history of PEC exhibit at Macaulay Heritage Park between 10 AM – 4PM.

This concert signals a return of live entertainment for family audiences to The Regent Theatre stage.

Twin Flames' music melds an array of different styles and genres because the artists believe music can help create a feeling of unity and collaboration between different cultures.

The duo performs original songs written in English, Inuttitut and French about courage and survival which honour their ancestor's and cultural history. Their award-winning music offers a unique blend of different musical styles and traditions. *Twin Flames* have released three full length albums and been nominated for 41 different music awards in the 7 years they've been performing.

This concert will feature an introduction shared by Grandmother Kathy Brant, a Haudenosaunee (grandparent), and Traditional teacher and mentor, from Tyendinaga Mohawk Territory immediately adjacent to the County. "I believe it is a privilege to pass on the teachings of the Great Law of Peace and teach how to bring those concepts of philosophy, wellbeing, respect, and living in balance with all the elements of Creation." ### About The County Museums, Indigenous History Exhibit:

In the Truth and Reconciliation Commission of Canada's Executive Summary, published in 2015, museums and archives were called upon to help facilitate reconciliation by changing the way they share the history of their communities.

This exhibit presents an exciting (and ongoing) opportunity to work in partnership with the Mohawks of the Bay of Quinte, Alderville First Nation, and other Indigenous people in the Prince Edward County community to develop a space that illustrates the historical importance of Indigenous peoples in the County, but also shows that these peoples (specifically the Mohawk and the Mississauga) are living communities with a present and a future, as well as a past.
